<u>Detentions (see separate flow chart)</u>

- 1. 20 minutes detentions can be given without 24 hours notice.
- 2. 24 hours notice should be given for all other detentions.
- 3. Whole class detentions must not be issued.
- 4. SEN students, who are collected each day by taxi, will complete detentions at lunchtime.
