As we come to the end of the long Autumn term, this is a perfect time to reflect on all the positives we have seen in these three months. Uniform and Equipment Reminder

We have a significant proportion of students coming to school with no bag and/or no equipment for lessons. Please can you ensure that your child has a bag and the necessary stationery in January, to include pens, pencils, ruler, rubber, sharpener, coloured pencils and a calculator.

We would also like to take this opportunity to remind you and our students of the uniform rules with regards to nails, piercings and coloured hair, as we know that holidays are a time where these are done. Students are only allowed one pair of stud earrings and no other body piercings, no false nails and no non-natural hair colours, and sanctions will be issued if these are seen in school.

Canteen Theft

It is disappointing that there are a small minority of students who think it is acceptable to take food and drink without paying from the canteen.

The canteen is an independent business. If items continue to be taken in this way, the outcome will be an increase in prices to cover the losses.

Anyone caught doing this will be given an automatic hour detention and will be issued with a 5 day ban from using the canteen and a letter will be sent home to parents.

Autumn term for the library has been busy!

It is increasingly popular at break and lunchtime with students borrowing books, using the computers to study, reading in groups at the tables or on the comfy chairs. We are well on our way to reaching 1500 book loans between September and December!

This term has also seen the successful introduction of 'Whisper Wednesday' to ensure that there is dedicated silent time for students to work or read without distraction. We have also celebrated National Poetry Day and Black History Month with displays and activities.

Year 7 are enjoying their allocated library lessons in which they have had an induction to explore the library through a 'book treasure hunt', a 'book tasting' session to highlight the range of texts available and an introduction to genre.

A new reading challenge has been launched this month: 'Genre Explorer'! This challenge encourages students to read outside their preferred authors and genres. Students will read 10 books over the course of the year, gaining a stamp for each book they read. When the card is completed, students receive Satchel points and a stationery prize or bookmark. The launch of this challenge has been very popular.



Christian Union – Foodbank

On Wednesday, a group of Overton Grange Christian Union students were involved in a community action project. They put together Christmas hampers, full of treats, toys, gifts and food supplies to be distributed to Foodshop customers, people in our local community who will benefit from a bit of extra help at Christmas time. The students carried and organised bags of donations, thoughtfully compiled the hampers, faffed about with the cellophane and ribbons and then carried the (quite heavy!) hampers from the Salvation Army church to the Foodshop in the St Nicholas Centre.

There, we learned how the Foodshop works. It provides food support to people on low incomes, as well as helping with other areas such as legal advice and emotional support. The Foodshop is one part of Sutton Community Works, a charity whose motto is 'faith in action' and Shweta, the manager, explained that the Foodshop relies on a large team of volunteers from local churches to run. It was very sad to hear about how many people struggle with food poverty in Sutton but interesting and also inspiring to hear about how people like Shweta are working to help people out of poverty. Mrs Buxton immediately recruited her to come to talk to students about careers in the charity sector.

In all, twelve hampers packed by OG CU students will go out to individuals, couples and families. It was a good experience to, in a small way, put our faith in to action by blessing our local community. Well done, all of you. **Mrs Fast**

Medical Needs

Please note the following from our medical needs policy (full copy on school website):

Parents and carers are responsible for alerting the school to any medical needs and conditions for their child. It is also the responsibility of parents and carers to alert the school to any changes to their child's medical needs.

Short term medical needs

Where possible all medicines should be administered at home. In the case of antibiotics doctors should be requested to prescribe medicine that can be issued at home three times a day (i.e. before school, immediately after school and at bedtime). Prescription medicines should only be brought to school where it would be detrimental to a student's health if it were not administered during the school day.

Long term medical needs

It is the responsibility of parents/carers to inform the school of any long-term medical needs and to ensure that the appropriate consent forms are completed and returned to school. It is also the responsibility of parents/carers to alert the school to any changes in

their child's needs and changes in the administration of medication.

It only requires the consent of one parent to agree or to request that medicines are administered.


