Monday 20th November 2023 Message from the Headteacher

I would like to say thank you to the parents who took part in a recent survey about the school. We are always keen to hear what you have to tell us so we can look afresh at what else needs to be done to continue our work on school improvement. From this feedback, there are a few recurring points I would like to take the time to address:

- 1) Uniform as you are aware, I am very keen to improve the uniform standards of our students. We have been working very hard on this and it is addressed daily with students, particularly ongoing issues with a small minority around rolling up skirts, knotting jumpers, wearing trousers slung low and not wearing lanyards.
- 2) Some responses stated that they would like to know what is being taught during the course of the year. We have updated all of our curriculum information on the school website this year, so that there is information on the curriculum for every subject, for every year group taught. This can be found at https://www.overtongrange.sutton.sch.uk/curriculum
- 3) We offer a wide range of extra-curricular activities but always welcome ideas for more. Again, these are listed on the school website at https://www.overtongrange.sutton.sch.uk/after-school-clubs. We aim to keep this regularly updated. In addition there is also the Duke of Edinburgh Awards, Arts Council, School Council and the many different House activities. If your child has an idea for a club, please encourage them to speak to their Form tutor or Head of Year.

4) Behaviour - as with uniform, this is an area that I have been very keen to improve this year. We have introduced new systems in school which are helping us to deal with issues faster and more effectively. However, we have been extremely disappointed and concerned about the behaviour of some of our students at the bus stop and on the bus. As a school we are limited in what we can do. We have staff at the bus stop four afternoons a week, and they will go onto the buses themselves if there is a need. We have held special assemblies with year groups when incidents have occured and we have put sanctions in place when we have been able to identify individuals causing an issue. I also reminders send out regular about expectations. We cannot, however, be available in the mornings, nor can we ride on the buses with the students. This is where I ask for your help, to speak to your child(ren) if you know they take the bus to and from school, to remind them of how they should behave and that poor behaviour outside of school will still be sanctioned.

The majority of our students do meet all of our expectations every single day, and I thank them for doing so. As I have said before, no school is perfect and we all make mistakes, but it is how we learn from those mistakes that we improve. We will be reviewing all of the feedback and doing our very best to act on it.


Foodbank

According to the Trussell Trust, food banks are seeing record-breaking levels of need, with almost 1.3 million emergency parcels being given out in just over six months. A huge 320,000 people have turned to food banks for the first time, and more donations are needed to cover the demand.

It is recommended that the child has their NHS number or some form of ID, but this has not been officially requested.




